My dear George,

Mme de Roerich asks me to write to you the following considerations as regards the N. Prize and since it has been my desire for some time to write to you, I will kill two birds with one stone and make this letter a long one.

Since you know already and it is no use of my repeating to you, that as soon as the N. Prize would be received, you would be one of the first to benefit thereby, I am sure that you will do all you can in order to consummate or facilitate its award to Prof. de Roerich, who is after all undoubtedly the best candidate living. We know that Prof. de Roerich has sponsored not only a number of Conferences devoted to peace, but likewise has brought to consummation an ideal that he cherished ever since 1903, a project which being calculated as an instrument to preserve for the future generations of humanity the achievements of Culture, was visualized by its creator as the best means of bringing about ultimately lasting peace and understanding among nations. In view of this, it is for yourself, who were directly instrumental in drafting the first proposal of the Roerich Pact, to likewise bring about the recognition of this most important contribution to human life in the form of the N. award. Herewith we are sending you information from the Norway Yearbook (date unknown) in case you do not have it already, as it may be of use to you as regards certain names which may be possibly approached. Beside the members of the Committee, there seems to be a close relation that exists between the International Peace Bureau and the Nobel Committee at Oslo. The President of the Bureau International pour la Paix is a certain M. Henri La Fontaine (particulars and address will be found in enclosed information). Perhaps it would be a good idea to find an approach to him with the view of securing his support. I am not aware, whether you have already solicited the support of Taube, Alvarez, Marin, Le Fur, Lapradelle, etc - in the form of their recommendation of the petition to Oslo, since they are best calculated to carry weight with the Committee. In case you have some other friends or people you may approach, please try your utmost to do so, in the nearest future, since while the petition had to be submitted before Feb. 1st, 1935, yet individual recommendations to the same petition will be useful at any time. It goes without saying that the United States will do everything within their power to foster this petition. Our splendid Committees in Belgium may be of the greatest help in this matter, but they must be aroused to action.

I am sure that with adequate perseverance and means the N. Prize will be granted. If there is a way to ensure its not being split with someone else (I believe this can be done only through inside channels) it would be most advisable to do so. No doubt the present difficult financial situation will soon rectify itself and again, my dear friend, your present difficulties will become a thing of the past. All greatest achievements are always brought about through painful labours. The brighter the light, the darker its shadow. And the opposition aroused in the vigilant forces of darkness, ever ready to pounce upon and destroy every newcomer, will be correspondingly great. Therefore do I say, have courage and meet with a lion's heart all obstacles ever remembering that it is darkest just before sunrise, it is coldest just before spring, and the saying "post nubila phoebus" is ever true.

Please convey to your family Mme de Roerich's, as well as Mr. Shibayev's and my own best wishes. Hoping that they are well and that you have likewise completely recovered from your recent indisposition,

My Very Dear Brother,

I have been delayed in my letter by
unfavourable circumstances but now I can
again converse with you and narrate a
few facts that will be of interest to you.
I have mentioned before the Book of Mithras
a book written by the Book of Mithras
which I thought it may
interest you. The Lama considered as
the incarnation of the Saint came
to see us twice and has now gone into
retirement for 10 years. I have taken down
100 pages of his and had them copied
for historical data.

I cannot tell you about all of them
but first of all spare does not

such irreverence delivered a blow
with the stick upon our father's head.
The blow was so great our father fell
down. When he got up his headache
was gone and he never suffered since.

I have found since in a book of travels
the description of the place of the
Asce^{tic}. but the traveller did not

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I visit him as they apparently had little
time at their disposal.

Having narrated this I shall proceed with
another subject the importance of it
you know of already. It is the question
of the Chalice.

I have compiled all data available
here into a little book together
with my own description of the Chalice.
I will now give a short translation
from the Travels of Hsien-Siang written
some 11-12 centuries back.
