My dear Dr. Roerich,

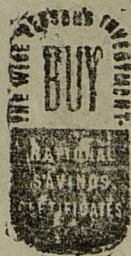
Thank you for your letter of August 2, 1948.

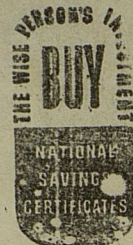
