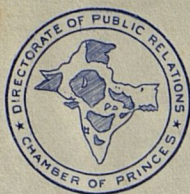

My dear Roerich,

My heartiest congratulations on your wedding with Devika Rani, whom I had met in Calcutta many years ago when I was on the editorial staff of the Statesman. I do not wish to bother you when you will be honeymooning in the Himalayas. But I will be grateful if you can, say early in October, send me an article on 'Encouragement of Art in Indian States' for publication in "Indian India", a monthly journal to be issued by the Public Relations Directorate of the Chamber of Princes.

2. When you were at Indore three years ago for your Art Exhibition, I had the privilege, along with Banny Richardson, to talk to you on the progress of Indian Art. And a few months later I published two of your articles on the subject in the "Holkar State Sentinel", which I was editing. The article may run up to 1,500 to 2,000 words, and if there <sup>are</sup> any illustrations, all the better.
