My dear Friend,

It is nice to have your kind letter of the ninth instant and to know that you are hale and hearty.

As desired in your letter I have handed over Rs.2/- to the Department of Information towards the cost of the two photographs supplied to you. I shall send you the prints of the Agasthya Statue in the Museum shortly.

Your Painting of our Maharaja is a success. You have managed to capture on canvas both the physical charms and the graces of the soul of this great Prince who has created history. Indeed, there is a vast difference in the technique of this portrait and that of other paintings embellishing the Durbar Hall. Some people here - long accustomed as they are to the sort of portraiture work of Ravi Varma and his disciples and followers, - however, do not fully understand and appreciate the unique charm of your inspired art. You have shown that portrait painting is not identical with photographi@ reproduction. It may interest you to learn that some local art critics expressed the view that the background of the painting is a little dark and that it is somewhat disproportionate to the figure. The painting in Situ/full of life and charm and it proclaims that it is executed by an original artist.

By the bye, what has happened to the smaller portrait of H.H. the Maharaja? I think you took it home with you. Dr. Cousins has also raised the same query in one of his recent letters to me.

I am sure by this time you must have received prints of Roerich collection of paintings in the Sri Chitralayam. I trust they have come out well.

My dear Friend,

Please accept my belated but none the less warm thanks for your hastily written letter dated the 16th July 1940 and for the Railway Receipt enclosed therein. Indeed, I was delighted to hear from you. The same day I received an M.O. from Gurudev Roerich to meet the freight charges for the Parcel.

The Parcel has not yet arrived here. It is ascertained from the local Railway Station that the Parcel is expected here some time this week. Verily, this Parcel is travelling from one corner of the vast continent of India to another end; I trust this consignment of valuable publications will reach me in splendid condition.

Just two days before I received your letter dated the 27th July. Evidently, this is the long letter to make up for all your silence. It is most nice and kind of you to inspite of write such an endearing letter axional heavy pressure of work. Your cordial letter has brought me great joy.

I note that of late you have been bombarded with much work and that you are some what free at present.

I am happy to find that the photographic prints of Rishi Agastya's image have met with your approval. It is inspiring to hear that you have completed a Painting of Rishi Agastya commanding the Vindhya mountains not to rise. This is yet another proof of your love and devotion for India and her great culture. I would very much desire to have a photograph of this Painting.

By the bye, do you know that there is in Travancore a place called Agastyakudam, (Mount Agastya) sacred to Risni Agastya. This Mount, twenty-two miles from Trivandrum, is 6200 feet high and in former days an Observatory was perched on its top. It is believed that Agastya, the Rishi, Physician, Theologian and Scholar had his above here. I have drawn some inspiration from your references to Rishi Agastya, and I intend writing an article on Mount Agastya and other places in Travancore associated with his name. I am sure your painting will be most suitable for illustrating this article, especially because legend and tradition aver that Rishi Agastya hastened to Mount Agastyar in Travancore and made his aboute there, after commanding the Vindhya Mountains not to rise. Hence, my request for a photographic print or two of your Painting.

You have not yet put into my hands material about your career as an artist, your art etc., to enable me to prepare an authoritative article. You had personally promised me that you would attend to this.

Your address to the Young Men's Association, Trivandrum has appeared in the garb of an article (To the Youth) in the Hyderabad Special Number of the Cochin Argus dated the 3rd August. Trust you have duly received a woucher copy of this issue. If you have any other contributions at hand, please let me have them for publication in the Press.
