



thinking and visioning.

He calls you to see the image of a hero, a saint, a martyr, when you expected to see the mask of a beast. He calls you to joyful assurance and faith, where you are accustomed to expect dissipation, darkness, and gloom. With exceptional heroic stoicism, he struggles to cleanse and wash the humiliated human image. Without flattery, without embellishing your weaknesses, he, as a master surgeon, knows how to separate the living, healthy tissues and arteries from the dead and infected ones -

George Grebenstchikoff established fame for himself on three continents of both the old and new worlds: Europe, Asia and America, as a man of powerful, creative thought in his social activities, and as an author of many books, some of which have been translated into as many as twelve different languages.

Born of a miner's family in the Altai Mountains of Siberia, he received recognition after a life full of daring exploits, of endless travels, and of tireless labor.

He toured this country as a lecturer for three years, and delivered more than 300 lectures before Russian and American audiences, in thirty-six states of America.

Among his contributions to this country is the founding of the Russian Art Colony, «Churaevka Village», at Southbury, Connecticut, with its own printing plant and publishing company, and the building of the Chapel of St. Sergius, as a spiritual center. This village serves as a new meeting place for American and Russian intellectuals.




