On November 20, 1944 your son, Corporal Spencer G. Campbell 11079303, Company C, 333rd Infantry, was killed in action in Germany.

Corporal Campbell met his dealth while engaged in action against the enemy. The entire division has suffered a personal loss in the death of your son for we knew him to be a conscientious and courageous soldier and leader. During the stress of combat he remained cheerful and cool-headed, and was an inspiration to his men:
