Dear Mr. President,

The Permanent Court of International Justice is meeting on November 5th next in order to examine two questions concerning Poland and the Free City of Danzig, and is expected to be in session until towards Christmas. For this reason I shall unfortunately be prevented from assisting at the meeting which has been convened to celebrate the anniversary of the First Decade of the activity of the Roerich Museum. I beg to express to you my very sincere regret to be unable to be present, and my best wishes on this memorable occasion.

Having been in correspondence with the Founder of your Museum, I am well acquainted with the work which your Organization is carrying out so efficiently. Although by different means, we pursue the same object, which is international cooperation and the consolidation of peace by mutual understanding of all the races. According to a Japanese saying "it is the

summit of our efforts". Whatever road we take, our aim must be to reach it as soon as possible. I hope that in the near future we shall meet at the top of this "summit".
