The heavy rains during the last week have badly damaged the road and motor transport has been suspended since the 18th instant. We doubt whether the road engineers can open the road to traffic for several weeks. In spite of our placing lorries at numerous points on the road before the rains we have not so far been able to link these up and arrange transhipment. All mails and fruit are now being carried by us over the Bhubbu Pass and we are afraid Mrs Horch will have to walk by stages from Kulu to Joggindarnaggar.
