2.—Neither the Director-General nor any Telegraph Company or Foreign Government, by whom this telegram is or would, in the ordinary course of the Telegraphic Service, be forwarded shall be liable to make compensation for any loss, injury, or damage arising or resulting from non-transmission, or non-delivery of the telegram, or delay, or error, or omission in the transmission or delivery thereof, through whatever cause such non-transmission, non-delivery, delay, error or omission shall have occurred.

I am writting to you as your elder brother. In reply to your letter I wish to state that not having heard from you in regard to our Parent I sent them a money draft on October 16th for \$25.-

Your suggestion that I send them one month the full amount, and you the other month suits me perfectly. Thus I sent our Parents this month and will send again the money in December.

You are accusing Sina, Frances and Mrs. Schafran of hostility towards you. I am witness that since your arrival in America all three, as well as myself have evinced utmost desire to help you and cooperate with you in our work, but you rejected it.

Since you presume an hostility also on my part towards Mr. and Mrs. Horch I must state, that you know very well, that in these 14 years of Service under the enlightened Guidance of our Beloved Leaders, Prof. and Mme de Roerich, I eliminated long ago all traces of hate, and you know that my heart is full of Love, which has been kindled by our Leaders, never to be extinguished by any human hands.

But I do believe that you, who received so much love and priceless spiritual treasures from our Beloved Leaders, that you manifested real hostility not only to our Leaders, who have done so much for you, but also to Mr and Mrs Horch, for due to your influence they have turned against their Leaders, who loved them so dearly. Through your influence Mr and Mrs Horch have deprived themselves of the greatest Blessings and spiritual treasures.

We have volumes of most exalted expressions written by you about our Leaders since you were in the Service, until just recently these expressions have been changed into disgraceful and baseless accusations. What shall we believe, those written by you for 12 years, or those of very recent date?

Apparently history repeats itself! The Coulomb case is still alive, when a similar case is looming up upon the darkened horizon of Human injustice.

If I ever would have been told that such an injustice will be manifested to our Beloved Leaders, who gave us the greatest privelege to participate in their great work for the welfare of mankind, I would not believe it possible, for I never heard that people who dedicate their lives to a spiritual ideal would turn with such a hatred against those who opened for them the Gates to the Stronghold of Light.

I worked under the Guidance of Prof. and Mme de Roerich since 1920 and never, not even once had I the slightest reason not to consider them the most noble, the most pure and Saintly people, not mentioning their High Source of Divine Inspiration, their unselfish Service for the good of mankind, their sacrifices, their constant love and devotion and ever burning desire to help all those who work for the same ideals. I could enumerate upon countless pages everything which these Two most noble human souls have already contributed towards the salvation of mankind, but read again over your own letters you have written to our Leaders since 1923. But above all hearken carefully to the inner voice of your heart and you shall receive an answer.

These Two Noble Hearts-Prof. and Mme de Roerich are bleeding from the wounds inflicted upon them in these unprecedented difficult times. But I know that these Two Hearts and the Great Heart is One, for the Three Shields are One. And whosoever stabs the Heart of our Leaders, stabs equally the Great Heart.

There is no hostility where the silver cord of Brotherhood is broken, there is no hate, nor love, there is just an empty space never to be bridged again.

Think very, very deeply before you proceed with your further actions.
