Dear Mrs Fossick -

I found the written record
of the dream of the new star. Here
it is: - February 4th 1942, 5:20 AM, Larchmont N.Y.

a star appeared in the sky at night, a new

to slow down and grow larger. As it moved to the
west and approached the horizon it grew to be
almost as bright as the sun, but smaller. The
