Dear Pat,

Greetings to you, Tee, and Dickie. Sorry I did not get to come out there with Gene and Janet and the children and say hello to everybody last summer.

Of course I am familiar with the correspondence you had with Gene on organizing Flamma.

I have a couple of questions I hope may be easily and briefly answered by letter. First; Can an individual residing in a foreign country deed property - a house or plot of land - to a United States corporation, like ours, as a gift or donation to an institution for research purposes, thereby relinquishing all personal right and title to the property? I mean, could we accept such a gift and have thereafter clear title to the property? Also, second; Suppose there is a scientific laboratory in a foreign country, with a staff, not incorporated but working under the name of, for instance, The Union Research Institute. Could this organization join us by simply adding "of Flamma, Inc." to their name? And could property held in their name be transferred completely to us by the same addition of three words?

I hope it is not too complicated, and that you can give me some idea of how such a transfer of property should be made - so that the work of the Institute would be under our jurisdiction and its property registered in our name, and protected by United States laws.
