Dear Sir:

No doubt you read the article in Liberty Magazine entitled "Can the Legal Profession Clean House?"

That the author knows what he is talking about is proved by your recent decision in the cases concerning the Roerich Museum.

I was present at almost all the hearings, and recored in writing on many occasions what I had just seen and heard in your offices while it was still fresh in memory. Therefore I am prepared to back up what I am about say, and I shall welcome any answers from anybody. I intend to mail and distribute as widely as possible this letter.

I accuse you first of all of PREJUDICE; secondly, of IGNORANCE and LIGHT-MINDED IRRESPONSIBILITY. There are other things of which I am only suspicious but which I am not prepared to bring open accusation for at present. However, that which I now accuse you of renders you, in my opinion, incompetent to sit with authority in any law case and represent Justice.

I am one of many who have been inspired by the ideas of Nicholas Roerich. Our ranks are constantly growing. We will not permit the Roerich Museum and its affiliated Institutions to be either crushed or usurped by financiers, lawyers and politicians, in conspiracy or otherwise.

The Master Institute of Unified Arts, Inc., is the School of Roerich Museum. Louis L. Horch is a traitor, slanderer, liar, thief, and vandal. I will not even mention the several relatives of Louis Horch, by marriage and otherwise, who are guilty in varying degrees. The one who is far more guilty, and carries the entire responsibility for bringing Louis Horch to his evil decisions and the Roerich Institutions into his black difficulty is Esther J. Lichtmann.

Knowing that there was an internal quarrel among the Trustees, Stockholders, Directors, Officers, Founders, of the Institution which they were representing in court, Greenbaum, Wolff & Ernst, without even trying to give an excuse, suddenly chose to champion one side against the other, and proclaimed themselves attorneys for certain individuals instead of a corporation. The law firm of Greenbaum, Wolff & Ernst had no right to decide who deserved to win an internal quarrel. The very title of the cases

which were referred to you by Judge Valente are as farcical as the way they were handled. The Founders of Master Institute of United Arts, Inc. appear as opponents of the Institution to which they have been devoting their lives for fifteen years and will continue to support long after your participation in this attempt to destroy it will have been forgotten.

You succeeded in keeping out of the record the name of a member of F.D. Roosevelt's Cabinet who has used his office and political influence to aid Horch thus far, and who is just as guilty in betrayal of a Cultural Institution and its Founders, toward which and whom he expressed devotion in word and deed for nine years.

You shall not prevent me from exposing him.

His name is Henry A. Wallace.
