The allege distance,

brought from Paris to helpt and treat M-me R., are all in French India still without permission. Even the physician has been refused a separate visa, although he came thousands of miles specially for the medical purpose of treating with new methods a dangerously ill Lady, who cannot otherwise be helped, as her heart and blood pressure make it impossible for her to leave the mountain heights. Prof.Roerich is a figure acclaimed now by the whole world for his great cultural ideas and ceaseless beneficial activities. Certainly this slander and persecution have given to Prof. and M-me R. and our Institutions the greatest fame and sympathy of the whole world, and if it were not for the tragic

condition of M-me R's health we could but rejoice at such world wide intervention for Rrof.R's right to reenter his home, which is not only his, but also the seat of American Scientific Institutions.

Of course all the slander about Russian affiliations has been denied by a letter signed by Mr.A.Hensersonnof the Foreign Office.
