Early in August the Government of India have announced their approval of the International Pact for the protection of Cultural Treasures, known as the Poerich Pact and Banner of Peace.

This ~~is~~ ^{is} of great significance that India, within the very first year of her independence should voice her adherence to the Treaty of Cultural Unity.

India's own great cultural heritage place her in an unique position.

and her voice, like the Mission of Gandhiji must be the voice of peace, the ideal of higher values and ever broadening horizons.

The real purpose of this Pact, as visualized by its creator Prof. Nicolas Roerich, was not only to preserve treasures of Human Jewels for posterity, but to ^{also} create a common unifying bond by establishing the principle of inviolability of the Cultural Values common to all humanity. Prof. Roerich always felt that this Pact should have an educational

value by awaining in the younger
generation from the earlier years an
understanding and respect for the great
achievements of man's creative genius,

The Idea for a Park of This Nature

in 1904 and proposed first to

and later to the Russian State
Authorities in 1914, though it

Famally promulgated by Prof. Powell
in America and the text of
this Treaty was published in the Paris.
Simultaneously Committees for
the Poor and Diseases of Peace
were founded in Paris, New-York,
Bruges and Bruxelles.

The Principle articles of the Peace
provide: "Educational, Artistic and
Scientific institutions, artistic and
Scientific Missions, the personnel, the
property and collections of such Institutions
and missions shall be deemed neutral and as
such shall be protected and respected
by belligerents. Protection and respect
shall be due to the aforesaid Institutions
and missions in all places, subject to the
sovereignty of the High Contracting
Parties, without any discrimination as to
the State Allegiance of any particular
institution or mission.

The Institutions, Collections, Missions thus registered
may display a distinctive flag, which will
entitle them to special protection and respect
on the part of the belligerents, of Governments

and peoples of all the Contracting Parties,
The Banner of Peace ^{The Symbol of the Pact,} designed by Professor
Roerich consists of a red circle
written which are inscribed three spheres
on a white field. One interpretation
of this symbol is the Past, Present
and Future achievements of Standard
Within the Circle of Eternity. This
Banner as provided for in the Articles
of the Pact is to be flown over protected
sites much in the manner of the
Red Cross, a similarity which made
some writers refer to it as the Red Cross
of Culture.

From its very inception the Idea
drew an enthusiastic response
from leaders of Culture, Heads
of States, and International
Organizations and Cultural Institutions

Three International Conventions
 for the adoption of the Roerich Pact
 and Banner of Peace were held
 at Bruges, Paris and Washington.
 Representatives of 35 nations
 participated in the Third International
 Convention at Washington and
 unanimously adopted the resolution
 approving the Roerich Pact and
 Banner of Peace and urging its
 adoption by other nations of the
 World. The League of Nations &
 through its Museum Commission
 has voiced its adherence ~~and its~~

In 1935 on the 15th of April ~~in the office of President Roosevelt at the White House in Washington,~~
 the Roerich Pact was officially signed by the
 representatives of the United
 States of America and 20 Latin
 American Republics ~~signed the~~

at the close of this solemn occasion
President Roosevelt ~~had~~
in an International Broadcast
~~had~~ delivered the following message:
It is most appropriate that on this day,
designated as Pan-American Day by the
Chief Executives of all the republics
of the American continent, the Governments
— members of the Pan-American Union — should
sign a Treaty which makes a step forward
in the preservation of the cultural
achievement of nations of this hemisphere.
In opening this Pact to the adherence
of the Nations of the world, we are
endeavouring to make of universal
application one of the principles vital
to the preservation of modern civilisation.
This Treaty possesses a spiritual
significance far deeper than the text
of the instrument itself. Let us bring

renewed allegiance to those high principles of International cooperation and Helpfulness, which, I feel assured, will be a great contribution to civilization by the Americas."

as the same Function -
The Minister of Panama, Ricardo J.
Alfaro in the course of his address
said: "The historic act, which has just taken
place" is one that marks a signal victory
in the perennial struggle of the better
sentiments of man against the savages
of War... A great idealist and fervent
Apostle of peace Professor Nicolas Ponce
conceived the plan of an International
convention for the neutralisation and
protection of the cultural treasures
of the world. And to-day the Republics of
the Western hemisphere sought and attained
the honour of carrying the lofty project
to a successful conclusion.... The deep
significance of this occasion has been enhanced
by the gracious hospitality which the
President of the United States has shown the
Plenipotentiaries of the Signatory Powers by
inviting them to perform the historic act in the White House.
