Like a mighty tree it must take time to grow up and the better and stronger the wood, the longer it will take to grow.

To sum up, much has been done in various directions to rouse people's interest in Art; we must now actively follow up the trails that have already been blazed and never relent in our determination of serving Art which is the infinite source of inspiration and giver of a Happier Life.

I firmly believe in the verdict of Plato who said:
