In this connection I wish to pay a special tribute to the people of the Soviet Union, who showed such magnificant, exemplary courage and an indomitable strength of Spirit in the face of seemingly unsurmountable hardships during the last World War when in spite of terrible sacrifices they were able to break the might of the attacking armies and free their brothers and the Sacred Soil of their Motherland from the terrible holocaust of Human misunderstanding, we call war. Many times in the past various invaders and military leaders underestimated that mysterious and unknown trait of the Russian People to stand up against the Tides of Human Wrath and bravely face the grestest, seemingly unsurmountable Trials. Trials which always resulted in an eventual strengthening of the Country and kindled a new strength and resolve within the hearts of the people.

For a growing, strong and developing country every year is a year of special significance, every year is worthy of special celebrations, of special recognition and remembrance.

To the People of the Soviet Union, to that great country I

send my feelings of deep affection and esteem.

If we cast a glance around us we see that the last sixty years have seen the greatest changes as well as great realignments in human relations. Science has made startling discoveries and made an unbelievable progress along the ever multiplying channels of Human Knowledge, in Research and its application. Nevertheless inspite of all these brilliant achievements, mankind has been placed face to face with new problems and the necessity to solve and discover new approaches to our ever multiplying needs.

Beyond this complex and seething pattern stand the Great Human Values which becken to us and proclaim the Eternal and Indestructible cement of Human relations, the binding force of True Friendship, Understanding and Love.

My Father, Prof. Nicholas Roerich always believed that the best way to forge strong and lasting bonds of mutual understanding between Nations and People is to do it on the plane of Cultural relations and discover the greatest and richest magnet of Human relations, the Field of Culture.

The vast Field of Man's creative expression - Art, in its multiform manifestations - was to him the Living Bridge which brings together and unites Human Beings. It is the Miraculous Bond which reveals and forges new approaches, new possibilities and opens new vistas of true understanding and appreciation. Across this vast Field of Human endeavour, Prof. Nicholas Roerich visualised his Realm of Mutual Friendship and Understanding through Culture.

We see now how practical and realistic was his concept of Peace through Culture. More and more people are joining the ranks of enlightened Men and Women who believe and know that only an enlightened, all containing, all embracing attitude can build a lasting Peace.

Recognising the urgency of measures to protect our Cultural Heritage Prof. Roerich evolved the idea of an International Pact, for the Protection of Cultural Treasures, Monuments and Educational Institutions, in times of War and Civil Commotions. Like the Red Cross, it carried with it a distinctive Banner and Symbol to be displayed over such Monuments and Institutions which were designated as protected. This Banner of Peace served to remind Mankind that there are certain values and treasures which are common and paramount to all Humanity and belong to everyone regardless of Race, Creed or Country.

Speaking about the Healing Touch of Culture my Father said: "Culture and Peace - the most sacred goal of Humanity! In these days of great confusion, both spiritual and material, the disturbed spirit strives to these radiant strongholds. But we should not unite only abstractly in the name of these regenerating conceptions. According to our abilities, each in his own field, we should bring them into actual surrounding life as the most necessary and undeferrable. We must not fear enthusiasm. Only the ignorant and the spiritually impotent would scoff at this noble feeling. Such scoffing is but the sign of inspiration for the true Legion of Honour. Nothing can impede us from dedicating ourselves to the service of Culture, so long as we believe in it and give to it our most flaming thoughts."

"If you shall be asked, of what kind of country and of what a future constitution you dream, you can answer in full dignity: We visualize the country of Great Culture. The country of Great Culture shall be your noble motto. You shall know that in that country will be peace, where Knowledge and Beauty will be revered."

The International Pact, proposed by my Father was adopted and ratified by practically all countries and reminds us today that countries can come together in a common purpose for the good of Mankind for the Happiness of our World.

The great People of India and of the Soviet Union are close to each other in so many ways and first of all geographically. Beside this they have many other bonds and similarities which contribute to a natural kinship and serve as links for better understanding and sympathy. At the crossroads stands a Mendicant and stretching out his hand,
he repeats Shanti, Shanti, Shanti - Peace, Peace, Peace!! The
benediction of a poor man. He wishes us his best, and in that
wish, these words contain the beautiful affirmation of a blessing
to all. Truly, Peace carries the promise of Happiness, the
Promise of Achievement, the Promise of Prosperity. Let this
Beautiful affirmation be at the helm of all our activities, all
our creativeness and hopes. And let us also repeat with the
unknown mendicant Shanti, Shanti!

Through ignorance, doubts and fear we deprive ourselves and others of a better and happier life, a life full of wonderful possibilities which await us if we but stretch our hand and seize that which Nature so freely and abundantly spreads before us to build a happy and beautiful Life.

Wherever Art is shown people gather, and wherever people gather around this Sacred core of Man's response there are the seeds of understanding and cooperation. Beautiful are the analysis of Art by Men whom we have agreed to call great, who constitute the flower of our Culture. who contemplated the spiritual Realms of Enlightenment and realisation. Plato said: "From Beautiful Images we shall go to Beautiful thoughts, from Beautiful thoughts, to a Beautiful Life and from a Beautiful Life to absolute Beauty." Beautiful and most significant are the words of this great Teacher. Gautama Buddha was once asked by his beloved disciple Ananda: "Master does not half of our holy life consist of Friendship with the Beautiful, Association with the Beautiful, Communion with the Beautiful?" And the Buddha answered: "Say not so Ananda, say not so, it is not half of our Life, it is the whole of our Life." Speaking of Art, Rabindranath Tagore said: "In Art the person in us sends his answer to the Supreme Creator who reveals himself to us in a World of Infinite Beauty across the Lifeless World of Facts." Did not Dostoyevsky with his great insight into Life tell us: "Beauty will save the World." While my Father, Nicholas Roerich wrote the following words: "Art will unify all Humanity. Art is one - indivisible. Art has its many branches, yet all are one. Art is the manifestation of the coming synthesis. Art is for all. Everyone will enjoy true Art. The gates of the 'Sacred Source' must be wide open for everybody, and the light of Art will influence numerous hearts with a new love. At first this feeling will be unconscious, but after all it will purify human consciousness, and how many young hearts are searching for something real and beautiful! So, give it to them. Bring Art to the people where it belongs. ...6/-

We should have not only museums, theatres, universities, public libraries, railway stations and hospitals, but even prisons decorated and beautified. Then we shall have no more prisons."

In his innumerable articles and lectures, my Father emphasized and analysed the Healing Touch of Beauty and the Universal appeal and influence of Art.
