Dear Miss Lichtmann:

Dr. Roerich has written me that you have received no invoices or letters announcing the sending of equipment. Probably our letters were lost in the mail, for I sent all notices of shipment to Naggar, addressed to Dr. Roerich; and the Hudson Forwarding Company inform me that they have also sent invoices to you, as well as to their agents in Bombay, King and King. I have now asked them to send you duplicate copies of the invoices covering the shipment of the five cases of botanical supplies and the one bale of paper bags. I enclose a duplicate invoice for the thirty-six cases of laboratory equipment.

Mr. Horch asked me to tell you that he is having a draft for 1500 rupees sent you, to re-imburse you for the money laid out for duty on the thirty-six cases.

In one of her letters from Moriah, Mrs. Lichtmann mentions that Mrs. Horch has spent over \$100 in express and similar charges. May I ask you to let us have a list of the expenses which you have incurred for the Urusvati, so that our Accounting Department can repay you?

We are extremely sorry that you have had such trouble with these shipments.
