Dear Mrs. Lichtmann:

Just received your letter of July 31st, for which, please, accept my thanks.

Regarding Dr. Zavadsky's proposals, I do not know, of course, whether it will be possible to carry them out, but I think it my duty to seize every opportunity of spreading knowledge of Urusvati's work. Dr. Zavadsky thinks she can raise funds for a biological laboratory in Naggar, Kulu. She has acquainted the members of the "International Radiological Congress" in Paris with the activities of the Himalayan Research Institute. I did not think it wise to discourage her, but it goes without saying that I did not assume the slightest engagement as to further developments. I have referred the whole question to Dr. Georges de Roerich, asking whether he would be pleased to empower Dr. Zavadsky with the gathering of funds for the above said laboratory, eventually under the auspices of the CANCER RESEARCH DIVISION of the NEW YORK UNIVERSITY. (.2) Generally speaking, I think Dr. Zavadsky's cooperation will be useful in Europe, and, as to the scope of this cooperation, I am completely in agreement with the thoughts expressed in your letter of July 31st. I expect, also, to get new instructions from Dr. Georges de Roerich on that point.

The work in connection with the Bruges Conference is steadily progressing, as you may see from my regular weekly reports.

Kindly let me know about the possibilities regarding subscriptions for the French edition of Dr. de Roerich's work.

My parents wish to be remembered to you. Please, convey my cordial greetings to Mr. Lichtmann, and to our dear friends at the Museum.
