Please find herewith Railway Waybil No:F/075092 for 1 case 12 seers mounted antilope's head, which please take delivery of and please forward by ordinary goods service to Kulu as usual, where all charges will be paid.

There seems to be however an error in the freight as the amount of Rs:8/-, for but 12 seers is more than excessive and we would request you to kindly clear up this matter with the Railways. There is no particular hurry about this case and we would rather have the freight question cleared up first, especially since you sent the same thing to Calcutta for us in May and the charge was less than half.

We confirm having sent you recently Rs:10/-/- per M.O. for fresh fruit supplies, and since the mango season is over and we expect no more fresh fruit consignments, this amount will more than suffice.

You will receive shortly by goods train from Bombay from Messrs Cox and Kings, 34 packages scientific instruments (mostly glassware, which please handled with great care) and 2 single packages from the same senders. Since writing you the other day we have received your v.p. letter for Rs:14/- as well as your letter 475/11 of the 16th inst.

We note from the waybill that the package weighing only 12 seers has been charged by the railways at Rs:8/-/-, as per East Indian Railway's waybill F/075092 dated 16th July, booked at Calcutta Bentinck Booking Office. Since we only paid about 2/15 from Jog-gindarnaggar to Calcutta, there must be an error in this calculation which we request you to clear up at your end. We have also instructed the Clive Transport Co. Ltd at Joggindarnaggar, NWRY, to take all possible steps at their end. We also note that you have charged us for packing Rs:2/-/-, whereas we had sent you a strong brand new box, especially made here by our carpenters with the intention to be used for the return journey. We shall be obliged if you will kindly adjust the matter of Ry excess freight, as the costs for this little will otherwise run up to double the mounting costs, which is prohibitively high for all future occasions.




