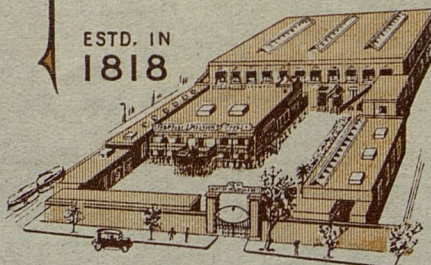

Whether infection also takes place through food, water or air cannot be definitely stated. Appearance ~~of~~ preliminary symptoms (fevers, nodules, patches) takes place from two weeks to more than 27-years of infection. It has been said that children of lepers are born free from disease and they catch the infection by living with parents. We, however, do not hold this view as a absolute. Warning:—Leprosy is highly infectious specially in the ulcerative stage. Patients should be segregated at once. They should not be allowed to use same bed, utensils, clothes, etc. Bed-bugs and mosquitoes are often carriers of disease.

Preventive Measures:—Perfect cleanliness must be observed in every sense, stale dried fish, bazaar meats, sputa-eating fowls should be carefully avoided.

A pill containing minute doses .001 gr. of arsenious acid and sulphuret of lime taken once or twice a month may be suggested as a reliable prophylactic. This should be taken by those who live in the same family with lepers. As a preven.

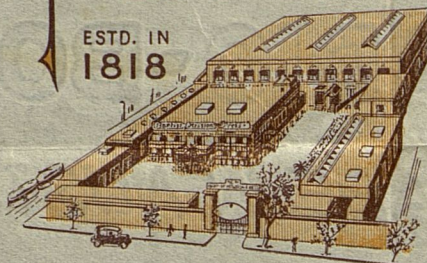

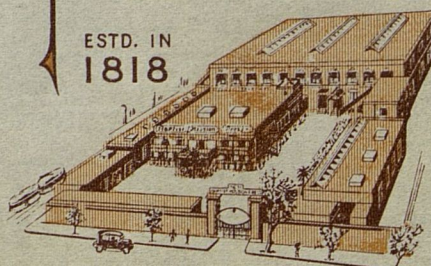

We thank you for your letter No.166 of the 27th ultimo, together with a copy of the Urusvati Journal which we have retained pending further instructions.

In response, we have pleasure in enclosing herewith our estimate for the printing of the Journal based on 500 copies and succeeding 500 copies printed at the same time. We have estimated in this way as you gave us no indication of the quantity required.

You will note that in our estimate we have quoted you for a book of 200 pages Super Royal 8vo. size. We have figured on two specimens of art paper and have kept the paper charges distinct from the printing charges.

Super Royal size art paper is not available in India, though it could be imported from England if you are prepared to wait its arrival, which would be approximately 2 months from date of ordering by Air Mail. This quality of art paper would be similar to our sample "A".

Sample "B" is of a lighter weight than sample "A". This is in a larger sheet also than the size you require and to use this would necessitate cutting to waste, hence the higher cost. We have a quantity of this paper in stock but probably not enough for your book. There should, however, be no difficulty in obtaining same in the local market.

We reckon that the Journal would take probably 2 to 3 months to complete with early return of proofs.

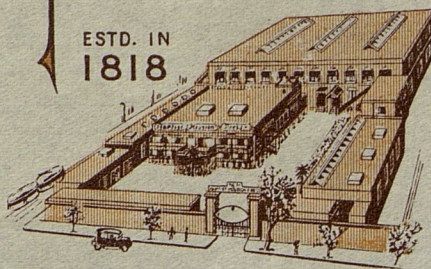

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 30th October, 1931, with further reference to the printing of the Himalayan Research Institute's Journal.

We note that you have decided on the sample "A" paper submitted to you for the body of the Magazine. This, being a good grade art paper, will permit of any Illustrations, Maps, or Portraits, in line or half-tone being printed along with the text matter; the only additional cost to our quoted page rate, therefore, would be the cost of the necessary blocks.

We have to confess that we do not know what a "Palatogram" is, at least by that name. We have not been able to include, therefore, in the attached estimate the cost of production of such. If you could send me a sample print of one I might be able to quote you.

Cover paper. The paper used on volume I is an American paper and cannot be matched in this country; I question whether we could match it from stock in England. All we could do would be to ask for the nearest possible match. I enclose sample of a paper which has come through this mail in a trade journal, which could be obtained if it met with your approval. It is a good grade cover paper, like that of your sample; the cost we do not know.

If you wish us to go ahead on the basis of the attached estimate, and will send me a cheque covering the cost of the paper, I shall be pleased to place the order immediately by air mail for immediate shipment.

Please note that you will need to measure up your illustrations and add the cost to the estimate given; half-tone work will cost you -/10/- per square inch (minimum Rs.5/8/- per block) and line work -/6/- per square inch (minimum Rs.3/- per block). Sketches and maps will reproduce by the line process.



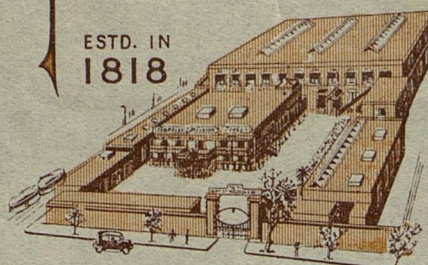

I have to-day ordered from England by cable Art paper for the body of book on the basis of 1000 copies of a 200 page issue. This paper should be with us before the end of the year.

Cover Paper. The thicker quality you send to me is not a paper, but a board. I enclose herewith a sample of a thin board which I could supply for the cover from stock, and which I think would look well and be very suitable for a 200 page issue, provided you are able to accept the change in tint. These boards are not available in the tint of your Vol.I.

Palatogram. Ordinary line blocks appear to be what are required for these, which can be prepared from drawings black on white, reduced or enlarged, as may be desired. As the process is by photography, you would get reproduced just what your drawing gives.

Phonetic Script. I am afraid I cannot say anything definite about this until I see the copy of the proposed article. We are just putting an article through the Journal of the Asiatic Society for which phonetic characters have been specially prepared, but these are in a different face of type to the one chosen for your Journal. If you will send to me the copy for the proposed article I shall be glad to let you know the possibilities.

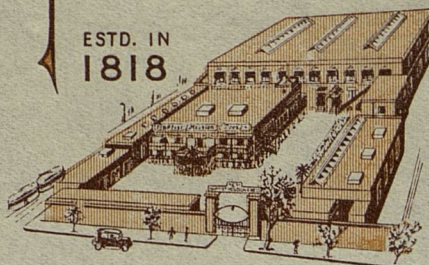

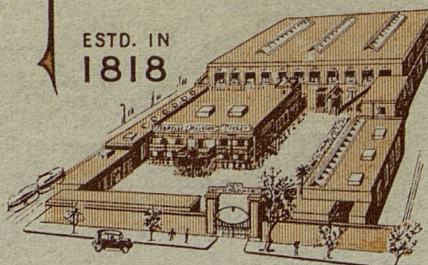

Yesterday I received from The Director, at Naggar, Kulu, Panjab, a registered packet containing the bulk of the copy for the forth-coming issue of The Journal of Urusvati Himalayan Research Institute, Vol. 2.

I find the nature of the articles so far received is such that I regret it will not be possible to set up the articles in the 10pt. Old Style type face which we submitted and which you have approved. In offering you that face of type we were guided by the copy of the last issue of the Journal sent to us, which had nothing other than ordinary accented letters, carried normally by all type founts. The articles already received are full of diacritical marks, most of which we have but only in the 10 point New Style face which we use for the work of the Journal of the Asiatic Society of Bengal. To attempt to make these characters in another fount would not only be costly but would entail months of labour. You are, therefore, I am afraid, bound down to this fount unless you are prepared to indefinitely postpone the issue of your Journal and go to the expense of the preparation of all these diacritical characters in the Old Style fount. I am sure that no other printer in India has anything like the variety that we are able to give in any fount whatever. I send herewith a machine proof of a page set in the New Style face - the face which we are able to give, and I shall be glad, if you are able to approve it, if you will wire to me the words "type approved", when we will proceed with the work with all speed. Until I receive such a wire I shall hold up the work.

With regard to the illustrations we note the following:-

Article No.III.- One photo block same size as copy for one plate
Article No.IV 'The Ceremony of Breaking the Stone'

Illustration Nos.1 and 2 are to be reproduced to same size as copy and make one plate.

Ditto for illustrations Nos. 3 and 4.

Article No.V. 'Panjabi Phonetics'

We take it that the blue pencil lines on the palatograms indicate your desire to have a stipple inset in the area so marked, similar to the ground work around the child in the print attached. The plus and minus signs in the stipple area would appear with a slight margin of white around the sign.

The cost of furnishing such a stipple would add one and a half annas to the square inch cost i.e. -/7/6 per Sq.inch instead of -/6/- with a minimum of Rs.3/10/- instead of Rs.3/-.

I am in receipt of your letter of the 18th instant asking the cost of 50 offprints of the article on "Lethichin".

I have held up my reply to this letter until we had the article in type and I was able to see how many pages the article would run to. The article is now in type in galley form and we estimate, when paged up, that the article will run to approximately 20 pages.

The enclosed estimate covers the cost of taking the type of this article after the first printing, reimposing the type matter, and printing 50 copies as a separate job. A cheaper method might be to print off 50 extra copies containing the pages of this article with the original printing, then cut out the pages and stab them together down the back. This could only be done if the article commences at the head of a right hand page. You would not by this method get a properly folded back.

Not knowing just how the pages of this article will fall in the formes of the original printing it is not possible for me at this stage to say whether the article would require additional printing in three or four formes of eight pages, hence it is not possible for me to give the cost, but the cost of this latter method would not be much beyond the cost of the paper.

We shall have to use the 22 point Tibetan script for each new entry of the dictionary; all other Tibetan words will have to be printed in an 11 point body. I am sending you a specimen page for our leaflet in which you will see that words underlined in red pencil are in 22 point type, the rest is in 11 point. Otherwise the dictionary would require several volumes. You will also see in the left volume of the specimen page that much of the explanations will have to be printed paragraph-like, in order to get the whole material into one column.

I calculate that we shall have about 140 Chinese characters in the whole text of the book. Sanskrit & Urdu words will be given in transcription.

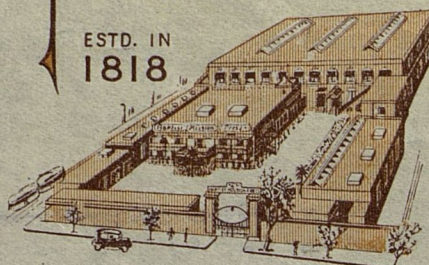

I thank you for the request for estimate of printing a Tibetan-English Dictionary contained in your letter of the 11th instant.

Before figuring on the work I should like to be assured that we have correctly interpreted your wishes. Does the enclosed rough draft represent what you want ?

Our main fount of Tibetan type is that used in the text of the Journal and is made up of two bodies 18 + 4 making 22 points. This is a good fount with the sub. and super accents well protected against possible breakage during printing. Our smaller fount is on an 11 point body with the sub. and super accents overhanging. This is not satisfactory as they frequently break off in printing. We can only recommend its use where just a few words are required, as in a footnote.

We have one Chinese fount of approximately 6500 characters on a 16 point body. We have a complete printed synopsis of this fount, each character having a distinctive number. When we are required to do work in Chinese we send to the Author a copy of our synopsis and ask him to give the number of each Chinese character on the copy. In this way we have been successful in doing small works in Chinese.

If you could send us a sample of your copy we would set up a small piece and send you along with our quotation.

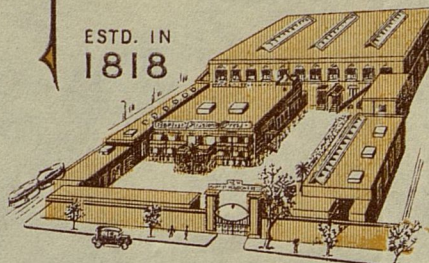

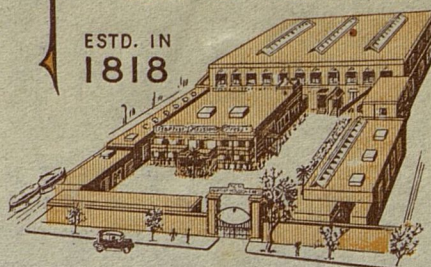

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant, enclosing one sheet of MSS. copy for the proposed dictionary, and a layout for a four-page prospectus relating to the same.

I want to say very definitely that I do not think our 11 point Tibetan fount would be satisfactory for such a large work as this Dictionary would be. The result would not be satisfactory to you, nor to ourselves. What is wanted is a small Tibetan fount cast on two bodies, like our 22 point fount, (made up of 18 point - 4 point) where the vowel signs top and bottom of the main character are separate and are supported from underneath. Any one body fount would, I am afraid, be like our own, with many of the upper and lower signs overhanging, unsupported, and in danger of breaking off as soon as pressure was applied under printing. If such a type be in existence, it would be worth our while if possible to purchase a small fount of it for a work like this Dictionary, but, in my own mind, I am very doubtful whether any such small fount is in existence. I discussed the matter with Mr. van Manen, the Secretary of the Asiatic Society of Bengal, yesterday, and he promised to look through certain type specimens he has to see whether he is able to find anything which gives promise of being suitable. Have you any specimen of a type which would be acceptable and, if so, could you put me in the way of getting into touch with the founder? We got an air mail letter off to Germany to-day, enquiring whether a suitable small size Tibetan is available in Germany.

In the meantime, we will get you out an estimate for the 4 pages prospectus, reckoning to use our 11 point for the specimen page. 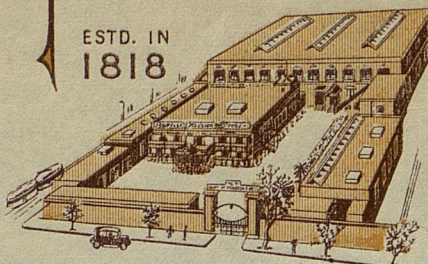



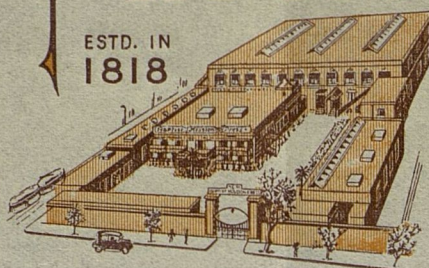

There is under contemplation the printing and publishing of a Tibetan-English Dictionary. The work is expected to run to about 2000 pages Royal 4to. two columns.

The work needs both large and small Tibetan type - large for the initial words, and a small type to use in the text. We have 22 point and a 11 point founts. The former is on two bodies: 18 and 4, the vowel signs being well supported on the 4 point body; in the case of the 11 point fount, there is just the one body and most of the vowel signs overhang and, therefore, break off pretty freely under printing. I hesitate to tackle a big work like this with such an unsatisfactory fount.

I am trying, therefore, to find out whether there is a more satisfactory Tibetan fount on a small body in existence, and available. The author of the Dictionary, in a letter to hand this morning, writes:-

'The Bengal Secretariat has a small type which they used in Das's Tibetan English Dictionary and in University Examination papers. This small type is clear enough but I do not know whether it is available.'

Can you give me any information about this fount of Tibetan type. Have you got such a fount? Is it satisfactory from the printing standpoint? If so, do you know where it came from? If you have the matrices, do you think it would be either possible to borrow them, or to get you to cast us a fount of type from them by the permission of the Bengal Govt.

I shall be grateful if you can give me any information in the matter.

I find that our present 11 point fount was cast from a set of punches lent to us for the purpose of casting a fount by the Jail Press. Is it possible that your fount and ours come from the same source ?

Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 11th instant with specimen of a Tibetan fount which you think might be suitable for your dictionary. You are wrong in thinking that this examination question paper was printed in Calcutta. I am able to say very definitely that all the Matriculation papers of the Calcutta University are printed in England. I have just put an enquiry through to the University Press, Calcutta, and learn from the Superintendent that they have no fount of Tibetan type whatsoever. I was already in touch with this same fount of type - the Tibetan gospels published by the British and Foreign Bible Society are printed in it. These gospels are printed in Shanghai and all the evidence with me at present goes to show that the origin of the fount is in China also.

Yesterday I spent nearly two hours with Mr. Van Manen and a Tibetan scholar working in the University here, in the rooms of the Asiatic Society, and we had a large number of volumes open before us with specimens of Tibetan types. As far as our investigation went, while books published in France and Germany present some very good Tibetan faces, we could find no trace of any small face fount existing in either country.

I could put through an enquiry to Shanghai if you wish and find out the possibilities of our being able to purchase a fount of this 'Shanghai' fount of type. I would point out, however, that the letters of this fount cover 16 points and the type is probably cast on a 16 point body. The use of this 16 point type for the text of your dictionary would mean a considerable increase in its bulk as compared with the type now set in the specimen page sent to you. Our small fount is at present on an 11 point body but has overhanging

characters top and bottom, in all covering about 14 points. I think I told you that this fount was cast from punches loaned to us from the Jail Press, Calcutta. This is the same fount as that used in Das' Tibetan Dictionary and several other works emanating from the Government Presses. I have been in touch with the Superintendent of the Bengal Government Press and learn that the punches and matrices for this fount were sold by auction in 1929 along with all their vernacular type casting plant. I was able to obtain from him the name of the purchaser, who is just an ordinary 'bikri-wallah'. We have sought him out and he has promised to make a search among his goods to see if he can find these punches and matrices. They did not appear to him of value (he bought them along with machinery) and he forgets what happened to them. We, however, have a set of matrices of this fount and at a cost of approximately Rs.1500/-/- we could cast a satisfactory fount from them, say on a 14 point body, when all over-hanging characters would be well protected against breakage. This would take us approximately one year to 18 months to convert and cast the necessary fount. I understand that the face of the type is quite good, and Mr. Van Manen thinks we should do well to go ahead with this. I am quite prepared to bear the expense if we are convinced that this is the best that can be done. It would mean however that you would have to wait until the type was ready before we could begin work on your Dictionary.

I shall be glad to hear from you further in the matter.

I am in receipt of your letter of the 23rd instant together with corrected proof of the leaflet. The corrections in the leaflet appear to present no difficulty; we are, therefore, going ahead with the printing, as desired.

In view of the MSS. copy for your Dictionary not being ready for 12 or 13 months, we have decided to take up at once the remaking of our smaller Tibetan fount on a larger type body, thus obtaining necessary protection for the vowel signs top and bottom of the letters. There are two things we can do: (1) make a matrix for every possible combination required in the Tibetan language and cast type from the same on a 14 point body; (2) do as we have done with the larger fount, casting the letters on say 11 point body and the vowels for top and bottom on a 3 point body, making 14 point in all. The former would be the better from the standpoint of composition and would give a better result in joining as between the letters and the vowels. The only consideration that would weigh against this method would be the number of characters required to cover all possible combinations being so large that the method would be ruled out by cost of production. Mr. van Manen thought the number would not greatly exceed 500 characters. We have at present 344 in the fount.

I am enclosing a print showing all the characters we have in the smaller fount, together with a print of characters we have on one body in the larger fount and not in the smaller fount. I wonder whether you would be kind enough to make me out a list of all the characters we should require which we have



not at present got. This would help us to a decision of the method we must adopt. Until this decision has been made we cannot proceed further.

- 1) Leaflet: Front page, please lower the sign slightly as indicated.

The words "Roerich Museum", should be in same all-capital-sized lettering as the words DHARAT KALA BHAWAN.

Second page: this is slightly heavy as it stands now. The text I sent you was in mixed capital and small type, whereas here the text is all in capital type. This would have to be changed, so that the text is printed like the word "Tibet". The Top line and the word "Reproductions:" is good.

Third page is good.

- 2) The Postcard. This is not in same deep rich black but I expect in printing a richer black ink can also be used. The reproduction in the leaflet is more impressive. As stated in my letter of July 12th, the text should not be under the photograph, but on the back and in very small letters. There should also be no line at the bottom, but an equally wide margin should be at the top and

bottom. The text at the lower left hand side at the base, should be as follows: "Madonna Oriflamma" - by Nicholas Roerich

If all these corrections can be done as stated, accurately, then no second proof is needed, and you can please print at once 3000 folders and 1000 postcards, carefully packed in wooden box, and waterproof paper to prevent damage by the rain in the hills here.

We have after delays in the delivery by the railways, at last received the 3000 folders and 1000 cards. The folders show very good prints, but the cards are not so intense in reproduction as the art paper shows. Is it not possible to obtain postcards of the same glossy art surface? As we may have many more postcards to be printed in future, if they can be made similarly to the reproductions on the art paper, it would be well worth while to investigate for such cards. Perhaps the art paper may be glued over an ordinary standard postcard, but this is only acceptable, if it can be done perfectly well, and will not warp, or come off, and show a clean edge cut.

We are sending you to-day under separate cover the block for the MADONNA ORIFLAMME and request you to try to make coloured prints on thin different colour paper, like the two cards enclosed herewith. "The Last ANGEL" will give an idea of what is required. Only the red in this case will have to be a denser richer carmine. As background various coloured paper may be tried. Perhaps you can also try some other combinations of colour background and colour ink print. If this work is successful we may often have similar work to be done instead of sending it abroad. The printing of this would naturally have to be done without a line around the picture, and this line, which is now on the block, would therefore have either to be cut off, or the paper cut after printing.

Enclosed is also a large photograph of the Institute's buildings. Please have a block made of this to exact postcard size. And if you will be able to get a better postcard paper in the meantime, please send some

if you cannot obtain a better postcard or find some other way out, then some other idea will have to be invented.

In the meantime awaiting your trial proofs of colour prints of the Madonna block, and awaiting to hear from you about the postcard,

Reference your letter of the 16th September, 1932.

We have had a block made of the Institute buildings, as requested, and send herewith prints on three grades of card for your inspection; we also send prints of the Madonna Oriflamme block on the same three cards. These are all printed with the same ink. I am afraid the result obtainable is not altogether dependant upon either the card or the ink we use. In the case of the circular we recently printed for you we were able to print on a cylinder machine, while in the case of the post cards we are compelled to print on a flat-bed machine. Cylinder machine printing of half-tone blocks gives the better result.

I am also sending you prints of the Madonna Oriflamme block printed on various qualities and tints of paper in five different tints of ink. The colour has been kept as regular as possible through all the prints but, as you will perceive, some papers take the ink much better than others.

I am sending you proofs in duplicate of each, so that, if you so desire, you can return one to us and retain the others.

We are returning your specimens and retaining the blocks pending your further instructions.

We have received your proofs for the Institute's postcard and approve of the PIRIES ART BOARD, which is sent herewith. Please print 1000 postcards in RICH DEEP BLACK INK, and please send same together with the block, to us by V.P. POST, collecting cost of block at the same time.

The text on the back is to be as follows:

- a) In the centre the usual word POSTCARD, & the vertical line, but no square for the postage stamp is required, as the card may probably be used as a rule in an envelope.
- b) On the very top left hand corner there is to be text, as attached to the proof. This text is to take as little room as possible, with as small type as possible, to stand in the centre of the left hand column, not more than a quarter inch from the top edge of the postcard. The Sign is to be reduced from the print sent herewith, to half inch size, and I would suggest for type: a six pt all caps bold face old type, or de-vigne, for the first two lines of the Institute name, and for the lower text the usual six pt caps and small italics.

I would further suggest that the vertical line be exactly in the middle, and the the word POSTCARD be in the center of the right column to balance with the text in the left column. This would, I believe give a better artistic impression.

We further enclose two prints of two other Signs (The Peace Pact and the Roerich Museum Signs,) and would like to have two blocks made of these (one of each) also reduced to half an inch. These may please also be sent and charges in the V.P. Parcel. Please do not send any printed matter by railway (unless so specified), as this takes a very

long time to reach Naggar (110 miles away from the nearest railway station) and rather make up two or three parcels. We have found that usually it costs even less by Post. Of course the printed matter has always to be packed in water proof paper, and in a wooden box.

About the monotone colour reproductions of painting of Prof. de Roerich, we shall write you under separate cover.

Please do this printing as soon as possible and please despatch it at your earliest possible convenience, as the postcards are urgently wanted.

You will note that 300, 800 and 400 respectively are required, and since the setting will be the same, we take it that it makes no difference in cost, to substitute three different kinds of paper or change the ink. But if a small extra charge is caused by this we are quite ready to pay such.

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th instant, dealing with the next issue of the Journal of the Institute.

I note that you have decided upon Antique paper for the body of the Journal, Art paper for the plates, and the same green paper as used on the last issue for the cover. We are arranging for an adequate supply of these papers for the issue. I enclose herewith a sample of 'Reliance Gorse' which we are able to obtain in Calcutta for the covers of the reprints. I regret that it is not possible to match either of your other two samples.

Concerning the price quoted for the reprints. This price is for taking down the formes from the machine after printing the main edition, taking the type matter to pieces, composing and changing all head lines and folios, re-imposing so that the first page of the article becomes the page one of the forme, then taking to machine, making ready afresh and printing. Apart from the actual type matter being set up, the reprints practically constitute a new job from the time the type is taken down from the machine, there being no other saving whatsoever other than having the text in type. This is the only way in which a sewn book to open flat can be given. If you are prepared to accept a stabbed book, we can offer you something cheaper, as we are then able to print at the same time as the main edition. In this case we just cut away the printed pages not wanted from the sections at the beginning and end of the article required and stab the pages together,

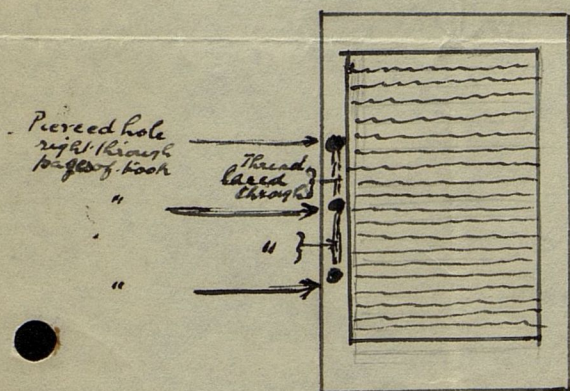
thus *, gluing the stabbed sections into a cover. A straight reprint in this way, without any changes, for 250 copies, we can put through at -/4/- per page against the Rs.1/12/-; If folios only are changed, the cost would be -/6/- per page; if headlines are to be changed completely, the charge would be -/12/- per page. A good deal of the cost here is due to the holding up the machine while the changes are made and revising done before the reprints can be struck off.

With regard to time. If you despatch on 20th Dec., it will be after Christmas before we can get a start on the work. We calculate that it will take three to four weeks to get 200 pages out in galley proof. After print order is given there is approximately a fortnight to three weeks' work imposing, printing, and binding for issue.

All the envelopes would have to be imprinted in the left top corner as per enclosed sample. If a thick Ivory finish $6\frac{1}{2} \times 3\frac{1}{2}$ envelope is not available, then Newman's American size Safeguard Cream wove (which is the enclosed sample) will have to be taken, but we regret the gumming is inferior and a stronger and better texture of paper would also be desirable if even the price is higher. (Newman's Safeguard cost 7:8 per %)o)

We are sending you under separate reg cover the small block as well as a sample cover, which we regard a very good one for our JOURNAL. Only it would have to taken into consideration that our Journal in this issue will be about twice as thick as last years owing to the the Antique paper. Should it be difficult to make the cut (though we think that with the cost of labor here it may perhaps be done by hand) then there will be no alternative but to have the flaps cut simply straight and use a wire staple. We would further suggest that the inner small flaps are made longer to meet in the center. Any your other sugestions or ideas would be very much wellcome. For these folders we would of course require gummed labels, of the size enclosed, but with same imprint as on the above mentioned envelopes. If such labels could not be gummed satisfactorily in India (we have been told that owing to the climate this is impossible) then some Dennison or other luggage labels (of which we enclose a sample and of which many different kinds are available in India) will have to be used, but they should be preferable white, having only a thin border line. Any your ideas and suggestions will be greatly appreciated, and we await your samples, proof of imprinting, and quotations. Last year we used cardboard and water proof wrapping paper for sending out the JOURNAL but it was a terrible trouble and much worse than these simple folders.

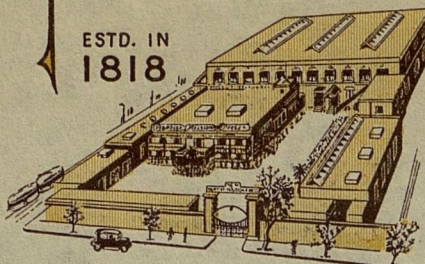

With reference to your letter of the 25th ultimo, we enclose herewith our estimate No.137/30 of date, for the printing of envelopes and labels, and the supply of folders for the Journals.

The smaller envelope being of American size is not obtainable locally, and we think you could not do better than get a further supply of 'Safeguard' envelopes from Newman's. These 'Safeguard' envelopes appear to be of local manufacture and, therefore, the gumming is not of the same high standard as the machine gummed imported envelopes. The specimen envelope sent herewith and on which we have quoted is of better quality, but the price as compared with that of Newman & Co., does not appeal favourably.

Gummed paper not being stocked in Bengal, owing to the humidity of the climate, we have quoted for the printing of the labels on ungummed paper.

I am afraid I have no helpful suggestion to make re the wrapper for the Journals. Material similar to your sample is not available in Calcutta. We are, however, sending you a wrapper which we have made by pasting together two sheets of ribbed kraft brown paper, having made it large enough to take the thickness of two copies of the last Journal printed on Art paper. This we reckon will be approximately the thickness of the Journal to be issued shortly when printed on Antique paper. We trust that the wrapper we are offering will be found acceptable and suitable for the purpose.

We were not able to reply to your letter earlier owing to our having to make enquiries in the bazars for suitable materials.

just been received from New-York, and although a 1000 was sent,
the parcel which we received only contained these 400. We trust
that if you will keep them in a dry place, and dry them well
after printing and return them as soon as quite dry, packed in
airtight paper, they will not stick to each other. If we shall
received additional supply, we shall send it on at once. If not
not we shall have to do additional printing later on.

200 airmail envelopes, the same sign, Institute's name and address to be
printed on the flap.

As regards the 3½x6½" envelopes we find your quotation of 28Rs per 2000
rather expensive, as it is much higher even the 9x4" envelopes, and
there would be no point in ordering the smaller size. We therefore
suggest that Newman's American sized Safeguard envelopes be obtained
at 7/8 per thousand or failing this, we would rather order a second thou-
sand of 9x4 envelopes at 11/- per thousand. Should there however be
an error in the estimate, as seems likely, and if the cost is 18 Rs per
2000 (and not 28/-/-) then your envelopes are acceptable and in this
case please print 2000 of these instead of the Safeguard. But the diffe-

rence in quality, nor in gumming, is not such as to warrant any higher cost than 9/-/- per thousand.

We also thank you for the sample of folder. It seems however that we shall have to wait slightly with this, since the actual thickness of the Journal is not quite clear as yet, and it may be by one and a quarter inch after all. Also does it seem that for foreign mail we would have to use some cardboard sheets around the JOURNAL, to protect the edges and corners as this ribbed kraft brown folders are rather flexible. It would therefore be of little value to have these made until the thickness of the JOURNAL is finally known. It seems however that there is still another possibility of packing, as we note that books, especially in America, are lately sent in cardboard boxes, of which we send you a sample together with the labels, envelopes, etc. No doubt these could be made in Calcutta, and if even they would cost slightly more, yet they have the advantage that they can always take some extra thickness. We would therefore request to make inquiry in Calcutta through your extensive trade relations (if you do not make cardboard boxes yourself), for a box to hold our JOURNAL, and INSIDE thickness not less than one inch. If there is any charge for such sample box, we are quite willing to bear the cost of same. Such a cardboard box would also do away with the necessity of using extra cardboard for inner packing, as the corners and edges are already protected with double thickness of cardboard. We would perhaps suggest to use the same strong ribbed craft paper for the outside, and if the cardboard inside is slightly thicker it would also be to advantage. 500 boxes would be sufficient, please quote for this quantity.

We are also sending in the reg. parcel the small Sign of the ROERICH MUSEUM, as required for printing the lower part of the labels. Please return both small blocks with the envelopes and labels.
